#### Official Opening of the Wildlife Area.

Last week we welcomed Nicole Gordon from the M.O.D (Directorate Children and Young People) to our school. You may remember that we were fortunate to be given £12,000 from the M.O.D Education Support Fund due to our increasing number of service families. Our bid involved refurbishing the Wildlife Area and building an outdoor classroom. We spent the funding on re-lining the pond and on an accessible board-walk through the area. This was done by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. The money did not quite cover the whole project. We are now raising more money to complete the outdoor classroom. (Now that the track project has come to fruition)

That aside, it was great to be able to celebrate what we have achieved so far. Nicole and four children from the school Alexander, Tom, Mia and Tabitha cut a ribbon as part of the 'official opening' of the Wildlife Area. We have in fact just started to use the area again after a period of regeneration. We had to allow things to grow and allow creature to return to the pond. There are some photos near the bike shed if you are interested in seeing what has been going on!

Nicole emailed a message to me after her visit and said:

Again, thank you very much for the invite. It was fantastic to see what a huge positive difference a little injection of funding can make to a school. I really enjoyed meeting the children, teachers, TAs and you. What an amazing job you all do for our children, including the ones from the Service community.

How kind! We look forward to using the pond to its full potential next year.
