Dear All,

This has been done for insurance reasons and also to acknowledge the great support the PTA and school receive from grandparents and the wider community!

I hope you had a good break. We have a very busy term ahead of us with lots to do and plenty of exciting things to look forward to.

## Termly Topics. (Home Work)

Well done one and all! The Termly Topics 'blew us away' this time. The interest in weather and climate was evident. Certificates were given out yesterday. What a great variety of ideas!

The Termly Topics are set for two main reasons. Firstly to cater for the spilt amongst families who prefer weekends free and those who want to do home learning at the weekend and keep the week nights free! We want you to be able to complete the written home learning when it is convenient to you. Secondly we are responding to research conducted by organisations such as the Sutton Trust which indicates that homework (unless designed carefully) has very little impact on pupil progress. The focus of the weekly home learning is to read regularly and to actually learn facts (spellings and number facts) which need to be recalled quickly.

The Termly Topic for this term is anything based on the theme of **'BRILLIANT BUILDINGS AND AMAZING ARCHITECTURE'.** Be as creative with the theme as you like. The deadline for handing in topics is **FRIDAY 8<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2017.** This is compulsory for Y4, Y5 and Y6 and optional for all other year groups. Pupils in the younger year groups will need to ask their teacher for a book to complete the work Termly Topic in as they will not automatically be given one.

## Poppy Appeal

The school has a collection tin for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Poppies will be available to children and parents on the playground before school during the school day and after school. We do ask that children make at least a 20p donation. The school will mark Remembrance with a moment of silence and reflection at 11am on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November.



## Museum Experience Day

On **Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November** Fox Class and Robin Class are working with a team from Salisbury Museum to learn about how museums are organised and to learn a bit about 'putting on an exhibition'. This will then culminate in an after school exhibition presented by both classes on **Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November**. This will take place in the school hall and all members of the school community are welcome to visit this exhibition after school on that day!

### Remembrance / British Values Day

On Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November Butterfly Class, Owl Class and Woodpecker Class will be taking part in a 'whole school topic day'. The morning will be spent learning about Remembrance Day and during the afternoon we will focus on 'British values'. Robin Class and Fox Class will also learn about 'Remembrance' and complete some work on 'British Values' at other times during the same week as they have other plans on that day. (See above!)

As a school we have a duty "to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs." We do this every day in the way we live our lives in school. However, we thought it would be good to spend a bit of time thinking about these themes in a more explicit way. The school's **'British Values Statement '**can be found on the school web-site.

This year as part of our focus on Remembrance we will thinking about the men who left this village to fight in WW1 and whose lives are commemorated in St Lawrence Church. They are known as the Stratford Nine. A booklet about these men has been complied by Helen Rowe and is available from the Church if you are interested in finding out more.
