Dear All,

I would like to start the term by thanking everyone for helping to make my 50<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations so special. I was completely overwhelmed by the good wishes, cards, gifts and balloons! <u>Thank you.</u>

I hope you had a good break. We have a very busy term ahead of us with lots to do and plenty of exciting things to look forward to. The Book Sale at the end of last term raised £56.05 towards a new Christmas tree. The PTA have agreed to donate some funds towards this too! Many thanks to the school librarians and Mrs. Williams for organising this event.

#### Home learning. (Home Work)

As you are aware we have been making some changes to our Home learning policies and procedures. Thank you for your feedback this has been very useful. We will continue to 'tweak' things until we feel it is really working well. We are aware that the use of Abacus has been a bit problematic and that reading needs looking at as the needs of the scheme readers are not the same as some of our older 'free readers'. The Termly Topics have proved very successful and I have really enjoyed looking at them. We made this change for two main reasons. Firstly to cater for the spilt amongst families who prefer weekends free and those who want to do home learning at the weekend and keep the week nights free! Now you as a family can complete the written home learning when it is convenient to you. Secondly we are responding to research conducted by organisations such as the Sutton Trust which indicates that homework (unless designed carefully) has very little impact on pupil progress. The focus of the weekly home learning is now to read regularly and to actually learn stuff/ facts (spellings and number facts) which need to be recalled quickly. We will continue to make little changes and hope to get more feedback from you about home learning at the mid-year point.

The Termly Topic for this term is anything based on the theme of **'Underground'**. This could be volcanoes, caves, moles, roots, railways! Be as creative with the theme as you like. The deadline for handing in topics is **FRIDAY 9<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2016**. This is compulsory for Y4, Y5 and Y6 and optional for all other year groups. Pupils in the younger year groups will need to ask their teacher for a book to complete the work Termly Topic in as they will not automatically be given one.

#### Poppy Appeal

The school has a collection tin for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Poppies will be available to children and parents on the playground before school during the school day and after school. We do ask that children make at least a 20p donation. The school will mark Remembrance Day with a moment of silence and reflection at 11am on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November.

#### Remembrance / British Values Day

On Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November the school will be taking part in a 'whole school topic day'. The morning will be spent learning about Remembrance Day in classes and during the afternoon we will mix EYFS/ KS1 up and KS2 up to learn about British values. As a school we have a duty *"to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs." We do this every day in the way we live our lives in school. However, we thought it would be good* 

to spend a bit of time thinking about these themes in a more explicit way. The school's 'British Values Statement 'can be found on the school web-site.
