Dear All

Some good news!

Before Christmas I wrote to tell you that I had submitted a bid to the MOD Support Fund in an attempt to get some money to revamp the pond area and build an outdoor classroom. (This would go on the scruffy area near to the bike shed). This fund is a government fund set up to help improve the lives of children from service families. It is hoped that the fund will improve the well-being of all pupils whether from a service family or not. I am pleased to inform you that we have been partially successful. We have been granted £8,500 to improve the wildlife area. I am meeting with Wiltshire Wildlife Trust next week, to plan a way forward. We did not get funding for our outdoor classroom but hope the PTA can raise enough funds to make this part of the project happen. As I wrote in our bid.....

Should this bid be successful the school's overgrown and dangerous wildlife and pond area will be transformed into a safe and accessible zone with an adjoining outdoor classroom, where pupils can produce high quality work in the fresh air.

This will help to mitigate the effects of deployment by providing an excellent accessible, educational resource, right on our doorstep. It will help pupils to be even more enthused about coming to school by providing first hand experiences and a meaningful context for learning. The importance of time spent outdoors with nature is well documented as having a positive effect on children's' mental health and well-being. This project fully supports the emphasis put on fresh air and natural experiences as currently promoted by the National Trust and their recent report 'The Natural Childhood Report' (2012).

The bid was 'sponsored' by one of our parents Major Bagshaw who wrote an excellent letter of support for the bid. I would like to thank him for his efforts. So exciting times. Watch this space or rather the space behind the school!!!
