We are always grateful for donations of cakes to sell as we don't always have enough and it's really disappointing for the children if we run out. If you are able to provide a cake please bring it with you on the night. No fresh cream please as we are unable to refrigerate it and anything containing nuts must be clearly labelled.

We always need helpers on the night to set up, patrol the area, serve in the kitchen and tidy up afterwards. ### **Jumble Sale – Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> March 3pm**

Why not take the opportunity to have a sort out at home?

We can sell ladies, men's and children's clothing and shoes, handbags and ladies accessories, bric-a-brac, small household items, crockery, curtains and duvet covers, toys, complete games and puzzles, books and DVD's. You can leave bags

or boxes of jumble in the 'sheep pen' area outside of the school office where they will be collected and stored in a dry area ready for the sale.

Please do not bring electrical items or VHS tapes as we are unable to dispose of them if they aren't sold. After the sale the unsold clothes and shoes are bagged up and collected by a company who pay us for each kilo they take away. The books, household items and bric-a-brac are donated to local charities, so nothing is wasted!

Sometimes we are fortunate enough to be given items that are brand new, collectable, or just too valuable to be sold for 30p. Rest assured that these are sold separately so that the most profit can be returned to the PTA school funds.

*Here are some ways you can help;*

- Give us your jumble! Why not ask your family, friends and neighbours if they have any unwanted items they can donate?
- Sorting the jumble and setting up the tables after lunch on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March. If you can spare the time just turn up at 1:30pm
- On Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> between 2pm and 5pm to finish setting up, sell the items, serve in the kitchen and clear away afterwards
- Donate a cake, or garden plants, homemade jams and chutneys

The PTA will be selling hot and cold drinks and cakes from the school kitchen. If you can, please bring small change with you as we often run out.

### **Bingo Night – Friday March 24<sup>th</sup> 7pm Entry, Eyes down' @7:30 prompt**

Tickets cost £10 and include a set of 6 bingo 'books' needed to play each game, a raffle ticket, nibbles and a drink token to exchange for a soft or alcoholic drink.
