The school has been working hard to prepare for wider opening on Monday 1st June. We have been moving furniture, altering staff working hours, ordering PPE and of course organising the groups of children (or Bubbles), as we now call them, ready to go.

The idea is that each 'Bubble' consistently uses the same indoor space, doors, toilets, furniture and resources. Our aim is to maintain the integrity of each Bubble, as far as it is possible. There will also be a strict hygiene and cleaning regime through-out the school day. Something we are now very familiar with!

On 1st June the school will be open for the children of **key workers, other priority groups** and **children in the EYFS, Y1 and Y6.**

Yesterday Mrs Watkins sent out an individualised letter (via e-mail) to each family with a pupil or pupils, who has been allocated a place in school on or soon after 1st June.

If you kindly said that you didn't urgently require a place and that you were happy to prioritise other people, you would not have been sent an e-mail. Thank you for your patience and co-operation. This has really helped.

If you think you should have received an e-mail yesterday and did not or if you require clarification regarding the information on the letter, please contact Mrs Watkins and she is very happy to help you and supply you with information. Do not sit at home and worry, please contact us. (It is possible a technical hitch or human error took place)

A letter has been sent to each family outlining arrival times, pick up times and other vital information, particular to their child or children. However, I would like to re-iterate the following points:

- Pupils may wear uniform or PE Kit
- Desks will be spaced as far apart as possible
- Break and lunch times will be staggered children require a packed lunch. (We are hoping to eat outside as much as possible)
- If the weather does not permit a picnic lunch Butterfly and Owl Bubbles will eat in the hall and the other Bubbles will eat in their classrooms
- Drop-off and collection are staggered only one adult should drop-off/collect. In the morning, adults should drop off and collect at the school gate and not come into school. Pick-ups will be from a designated place on the playground
- Adults must not gather in groups at the beginning and end of the day and observe social distancing rules
- Children must wash/gel hands on arrival staff will help and support with this task
- Resources which are shared / taken home should be limited all books will stay in school. Please do not bring in book bags to and from home
- The sharing of stationery is limited pupils may bring in their own pencil case and the contents are for their use only
- Early Birds and Night Owls is suspended till further notice.

At our school, we shall be implementing the DFE guidance and also endeavouring to keep children's' well-being and over-all health at the centre of what we do. Please bear in mind that we will try to encourage children to socially distance in school, but this will not happen all the time.

Our overall rationale is to follow the guidance set out by the DFE:

- minimising contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend childcare settings, schools or colleges
- cleaning hands more often than usual wash hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered
- ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- cleaning frequently touched surfaces often using standard products, such as detergents and bleach
- <u>minimising contact and mixing</u> by altering, as much as possible, the environment (such as classroom layout) and timetables (such as staggered break times)
