Some of the children working in Butterfly


Bubble made a model of a volcano and then made it erupt using baking soda, vinegar, washing up liquid and some food colouring.



Owl Bubble have been thinking about 'Transport'. They compared old and new modes of transport, experimented with cars travelling over different surfaces, made boats and then raced them. They also made 'ice cube boats' to see how fast they melted and how it affected them floating.
