

I hope you had a good break. We have a very busy term ahead of us with lots to do and plenty of exciting things to look forward to.

### **Termly Topics: My Bedroom**

Well done one and all! Some of the Termly Topics were very impressive. Certificates were given out before the holiday but I would like to give an extra mention to: **Becky Ashton, Macey Down, Sonny De Bens, Neo Griffin, Rose Vigor, Rufus White and Sophie Wood**, for their creativity when interpreting the theme. They have all been chosen for a special 'Creativity Award' to recognise their interesting and inspiring responses to 'My Bedroom' Please do take a look at a selection of the Termly Topics in the hall when they go on display.

The Termly Topics are set for two main reasons. Firstly to cater for the spilt amongst families who prefer weekends free and those who want to do home learning at the weekend and keep the week nights free! We want you to be able to complete the written home learning when it is convenient to you. Secondly we are responding to research conducted by organisations such as the Sutton Trust which indicates that homework (unless designed carefully) has very little impact on pupil progress or creativity.

The focus of the weekly home learning is to read regularly and to actually learn facts (spellings and number facts) which need to be recalled quickly. Practising reading is also a very important thing to do as regularly as possible!

The Termly Topic for this term is anything based on the theme of 'Underground'. This could be volcanoes, caves, diamonds, moles, roots or railways! Be as creative with the theme as you like. The deadline for handing in topics is **FRIDAY 13<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2019**. This is compulsory for Y4, Y5 and Y6 and optional for all other year groups. Pupils in the younger year groups will need to ask their teacher for a book, to complete the Termly Topic work in, as they will not automatically be given one.

### **Poppy Appeal**

The school has a collection tin for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Poppies are available to children and parents on the playground before school during the school day and after school. We do ask that children make at least a 20p donation. The school will mark Remembrance with a moment of silence and reflection at 11am on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November.



### **Remembrance / British Values Day**

On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November the school is holding a 'whole school topic day'. The morning will be spent learning about Remembrance Day and during the afternoon we will focus on 'British values'. As a school we have a duty "to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs." We do this every day in the way we live our lives in school. However, we thought it would be good to spend a bit of time thinking about these themes in a more explicit way. ### **Reading Room Car Park**

The church very kindly let us use the Reading Room car park. However, on Fridays they have a booking and need the car parking spaces near the building. **Please kindly use the half of the car park, furthest away from the Reading Room on Friday mornings.** When using the car park please park in a way that maximizes the use of available space.
