After coronavirus played havoc with the 2020 sporting calendar, 2021 is crammed with big events to thrill and entertain.

Euro 2020, the Olympic and Paralympic Games, a Lions tour of South Africa, a Rugby League World Cup in England and cricket's inaugural Hundred tournament are just some of the many highlights.

The Euros start on 11 June and consist of 51 matches in 12 cities across Europe, with the highlight of the group stage coming on Friday, 18 June when England host Scotland at Wembley. Wales, semi-finalists in 2016, have also qualified and are in the same group as former winners Italy.
