The Trussell Trust was founded in 1997 in Salisbury and has then grown setting up multiple food banks across the country. Some of them are independent although come under the Trussell Trust umbrella. 3 years ago Salisbury Foodbank became independent too, this means that as a charity any fundraising we do goes directly to local residents. Donations made to the Trussell Trust are distributed nationally whereas donations to The Salisbury Food Bank goes directly to the residents of Salisbury. They accept donations of food or money. We have chosen to use this idea as an optional writing competition in school, to encourage our pupil's to write creatively.

Entries for our competition are being accepted from today! The date the competition will close is **Friday 10th November.**

Your child can choose whatever they want to write a story about – this is their chance to be truly creative!

All the stories **must**:

- Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)
- Be written by an individual and not a group
- Be a child's own original idea
- Be prose, not a rap or poem

Stories must not:

- Give any personal details of the child, including their name
- Recount an historical event (but they can use a real person or historical character as a source of inspiration)

All stories will be judged on the following criteria:

- Characterisation
- Plot
- Originality
- Language
- Enjoyment

The stories will be judged by the staff, and we will award prizes for EYFS/KS1 winners and runners up, and KS2 winners and runners up.

Parking and the Reading Rooms carpark

From Monday 2nd October 2023, work will begin on treating the Death Watch beetle in the chancel roof. This will mean that part of the car park will be closed off. Parents are welcome to continue using the half of the carpark that remains open. It is expected that the work will last approximately three weeks.

This will have a knock on effect to the parking outside school. Our school was first built in 1840 and the village is not designed for the amount of traffic from the school and from people using it as a way into Salisbury. Please can I remind you to drop your children in the morning and then leave so that there is room outside the school.

Also, please can I remind everyone not to park on the zig zags outside school or the double yellow lines, especially by Mill Lane. It makes it very difficult to see oncoming traffic for our pupils who walk home.
