Please remember we do try and get outside as much as we can for PE, especially with the older children. Having a coat in school every day is essential with our British weather!

#### **School Meals**

School meals will continue to cost £3.00. This service has to be <u>subsidised</u> by the school budget when the uptake is low or when children do not have their Universal Free School Meal. The subsidy gets less as more children have hot meals. The meals are delicious and are good value for money at £3.00. The governors have a duty to provide meals but they do not have to be hot. Please support our hot meal service; it will not survive if we as a school are unable to meet higher and higher subsidies. This takes money from the education budget!

#### School Meals for Pupils in Yr 3

Pupils in Year 3 are no longer entitled to Universal Free School Meal.

How it works - School Meals **must be paid in advance** on ParentPay. They cost £3 per meal. You can put a lump sum on your child's ParentPay School Meal Payment Account and as your child has a dinner the money will automatically be deducted off the lump sum.

#### THINGS TO REMEMBER AND BE AWARE OF...

# Children need to bring:

Snack and drinks for the day including a water bottle with a sports top. (Named please)

Please do not provide your child with nuts for their snack or packed lunch as we do have children with nut allergies.

Because we have so many children, with allergies and dietary needs we are <u>unable to allow</u> <u>birthday cakes or sweets</u> to come into school.

#### Also..

School rules **DO** apply before and after school. Children (and adults!) must **NOT** 

- play on the grass verge by the fence outside the school (before and after school)
- swing on the weeping willow tree outside school
- climb on fences or gates (use gates)
- climb under fences (use gates)
- play on the field\*, track or in the den area (before and after school).
- venture into the garden area
- get out play equipment (except for that provided in the morning)
- stand on picnic benches (people don't want to sit on your muddy foot prints!)
- cycle or scoot on the premises, please wheel your cycles and scooters to the gate.

#### Adults please do not...

- come into buildings without a member of staff inviting you inside
- park on the zig-zag lines, double yellow lines or in the bus-stop.

Please come and see either of us if you have concerns about anyone's behaviour!
