Christmas came early this week as we received the report from our SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection.

I am SO very proud of the report and everything that it says about our school, children, staff and community! As you will see from the full report which is attached with this newsletter and will be available on the website, we have received 'Judgement One'. This is the highest judgement achievable and suggests that, through the school's vision and practice, we are living up to our foundation as a Church school enabling pupils and adults to flourish.

I believe that the inspector really understood our school and she has highlighted how: 'Relationships within the school are excellent. Inspired by the vision, this is a school where pupils and adults feel understood, valued and nurtured.' She also praised the school saying 'A profound internal culture of acceptance and belonging enables 'Team Stratford' to thrive together, as well as each member being valued for their uniqueness.'

Mrs Robinson also commented on the 'tangible sense of belonging pervading the school, which is warm and inclusive. This deep communal identity is known by pupils and adults as 'Team Stratford'. It is the school's shorthand to convey its all-embracing culture of acceptance and worth.' The inspection was highly complementary of our relationship with the church saying 'the partnership between the school and the local church is natural, heartfelt and mutually nourishing.' I could not be prouder of the report and all that it says about our school. It is testament to our children, staff, governors, families and wider community that this report reflects the commitment of all to 'live life in all its fullness'. Stratford truly is an extraordinary school, where everyone, child or adult, is known and valued as an individual and our strong Christian ethos and values help ensure that everyone flourishes.

#### Butterfly and Owl Class Nativity – Prickly Hay

This year the pupils in EYFS, Y1 and Y2 will be performing 'Prickly Hay' on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December 2024. A dress rehearsal in front of the whole school will take place on the morning of Tuesday 10th December with performances to families taking place on the following two days. The children will perform on both of these days, but to simplify ticket allocation, we have designated a day for the families of each class to come along.

Tickets are free for the performances and were sent home on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November. Every child was allocated 3 tickets for their designated 'class performance'.
