Mrs Waters has arranged for Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity to come into school, on **Monday 9th February 2026**, to deliver their Aware+ programme. As part of the PSHE curriculum, all schools should provide First Aid training to its pupils. The course content is matched to the age of the children and adapted for individual needs.

We recognise that children may have experience of first aid situations involving the emergency services and encourage you to let your child's school know if this is the case. All topics are covered sensitively and at an age-appropriate level.

Safer Internet Day – Tuesday 10th February 2026

This Safer Internet Day we are exploring the impact of AI on all of our lives, looking at how AI can be used for good, and giving advice and guidance that empowers people to use AI safely and responsibly.


WEDNESDAY 25TH FEBRUARY AND THURSDAY 26TH FEBRUARY

World Book Day is actually 5th March 2026, however as this is a PE day we are going to celebrate on **Wednesday 4th March 2026**.


